

SAMUEL EDWARD KONKIN III is editor and publisher of the journal New Libertarian. A leader of the anti-political action and anti-Libertarian Party faction in the libertarian movement, Konkin has a Master's degree in Theoretical Chemistry from New York University. During the early years of the Libertarian Party, Konkin led the Radical Caucus of the New York Free Libertarian Party, which controlled 20 to 30 percent of the delegates at the first state

convention. The Radical Caucus' main objective was to dismantle the LP from within, Konkin is the originator of the term "Counter-Economics."



JOHN JOSEPH MATONIS, a graduate of Temple University School of Law, has championed anti-government causes in court for over 15 years. Best known for his battles with the IRS, Matonis has also defended (in high court) freedom of religion, opposition to the draft, rights of mental patients, and the rights of consumers and medical patients to use vitamins, Laetrile, and other treatments. Currently, he is working with two legal research computer systems

which monitor the operations of the Franchise Tax Board, the Board of Equalization, and the IRS. Matonis is editor and publisher of Little Guy (Box 2885 Fullerton, CA 92633) which advocates and reports on the use of "Monkey Wrench Law" to sabotage the machinery of government.



CARL NICOLAI, president of the Seattle-based Cryptext Corporation, is an electronics designer and co-inventor of a commercial and CB voice scrambler which was banned by the National Security Agency (Nicolai finally was able to get the government to lift the ban, with support from the media and several Congressmen). A more recent privacy-protection device, the Cryptext encryption device, was demonstrated at the 1980

Conference (it can be plugged into microcomputers). His struggles (and those of his fellow inventors) with the government are chronicled in a recent Reason article ("Data Privacy: What Washington Doesn't Want You to Know," January 1981).



LOWELL PONTE, author of The Cooling, has been a KPFK radio commentator/show host for over 11 years. He has appeared frequently on the Today Show, Tomorrow Show and Good Morning America. He is a contributing editor of *Politics Today*, science editor of Gallery, editor of New Energy, and contributing editor of Reason. Ponte is the Los Angeles Times Senior Book Reviewer, as well as being a syndicated columnist; his writings have appeared

in such publications as Penthouse, Reader's Digest, New York Times, and Human Events.



ROBERT W. POOLE, JR., author of Cutting Back City Hall, is president of Reason Foundation (Santa Barbara, CA). Editor of Reason magazine (published by Reason Foundation), Poole writes a monthly newspaper column, "Fiscal Watchdog," which appears in over 160 newspapers across the country. His articles on public policy have appeared in such periodicals as The Futurist, Inquiry. The Freeman, and Reader's Digest. Poole holds 2 engineering

degrees from MIT and has pursued additional graduate studies in management science at NYU. Chairman of the Local Government Center (a research institute). he is currently editing Instead of Regulations, a new book on alternatives to federal regulatory agencies.



FRED SCHNAUBELT was elected to the San Diego City Council in 1977 as an outspoken advocate of the free market. An active supporter of both Proposition 13 and the Gann Initiative. Schnaubelt was instrumental in deregulating the taxi business in San Diego. In 1977 he announced support for an initiative to repeal California's sales tax. Schnaubelt is currently involved in a lawsuit against the San Diego City Council and the Redevelopment

Agency over a government-sponsored redevelopment project.



JOYCE SHULMAN, Ph.D. is in full time private practice doing individual therapy, marital and family therapy, psychological diagnostic evaluation, group therapy and the supervision and training of psychotherapists for Wayne State University and the Merrill Palmer Institute of Detroit, Michigan, Dr. Shulman has been a guest lecturer at several colleges and universities. She is Executive Vice-President of a Blue Cross/Blue Shield Outpatient

Psychiatric Clinic in Michigan, and of the Institute for Personal Development in California; she served on the Board of directors of We Can Do, a self-help organization that was formed to deal with people suffering from cancer. Dr. Shulman has appeared on radio and television discussing various aspects of psychology and counseling.



LEE M. SHULMAN. Ph.D., is co-author (with Joan Kennedy Taylor) of When to See a Psychologist. He has formerly served as a Clinical Psychologist with the Recorders Court Psychiatric Clinic (City of Detroit) and the Domestic Relations Division. From 1956 to the present. Dr. Shulman has been in full time private practice, doing individual therapy, group therapy, marital and family therapy, psychological diagnostic evaluation, industrial counseling, and supervision and training of psychotherapists. He has served as guest lecturer

for graduate and undergraduate students at many universities, and is Director of a Blue Cross/Blue Shield Outpatient Psychiatric Clinic in Michigan and of the Institute for Personal Development in California.



GEORGE H. SMITH, author of Atheism: The Case Against God. studied philosophy at the University of Arizona. He is a research fellow for the Institute for Humane Studies, which is funding his new book (co-authored with Jack High) on voluntary schooling vs. government schooling (forthcoming from Avery Publishing). Smith has lectured extensively for the Cato Institute, Dissent School, and the Forum for Philosophical Studies. He has published in Journal

of Libertarian Studies, Reason magazine, Libertarian Review, and other periodicals.

SHAWN STEEL is an attorney (USC law school graduate), and one of the main founders of the Future of Freedom libertarian conference series dating back to 1969. Currently editor of the Libertarian Law Notes, newsletter of the Libertarian Law Council. Steel is also Honorary Chair of this year's Future of Freedom Conference.

CONFERENCE LOCATION


