

Speakers

Timothy Leary, is one of recent history's most controversial figures; his scientific and philosophic ideas have had a significant impact on our culture. His ground-breaking work at the Kaiser Foundation in the 1950's helped revolutionize traditional approaches to psychotherapy (he is the early founder of the humanistic psychology movement, and author of 20 books). At Harvard University in 1960, he began the Psychedelic Research Project which soon became the subject of sensationalized publicity, and Leary left Harvard. In the early 1970's, Leary was jailed on pot charges, receiving a sentence of 20 years. He

escaped, spent several years in exile, and was kidnapped and returned to the States. Leary was jailed for 31/2 additional years.



Irwin Schiff

Irwin Schiff, author of The Biggest Con: How The Government Is Fleecing You, is considered to be the father of the modern tax rebellion. A graduate of the University of Connecticut in economics and accounting, Schiff has openly stated that he hasn't paid income taxes since 1973. Unabashed and pending appeal on his latest conviction for failure to file tax returns. he recently published The Kingdom of Moltz, a story picture book with cartoon drawings. Schiff has appeared on numerous radio and TV talk shows, including Tom Snyder's "Tomorrow Show," "The David Susskind Show," "Mid-Morning LA" and Howard Ruff's "Ruff House."

Karl Hess, (back this year by popular demand) is a former Republican Party ghostwriter and speechwriter for Barry Goldwater ("Extremism in the defense of liberty is no vice") and Presidents Nixon and Ford. A former editor of Newsweek, he was denounced by William F. Buckley for his infamous statement. "I love the country. I loathe the nation." Hess turned New Left in the late 1960's preaching decentralized economics and anarchism. His best-known book is Dear America. He is also

well-known for his award-winning 1969 Playboy article. "The Death of Politics." Hess has become known in recent years for

his advocacy of do-it-yourself small-scale technology (and its applications to practical survival techniques), and is currently an editor of the journal Survival Tomorrow. Most recently, a short film on Karl Hess won an Academy Award (Oscar) on March 31, 1981 in Hollywood.

OTHER SPEAKERS

Robert LeFevre has been a fountainhead of the West Coast libertarian movement almost since its inception. In 1956 he founded the Freedom School near Colorado Springs (later renamed Rampart College). LeFevre is the author of This Bread Is Mine, The Nature of Man & His Government, The Philosophy of Owner-





RAMPART INSTITUTE

The Institute of the 1980's and Beyond!

Rampart Institute was founded at the eighth Future of Freedom Conference at Cypress College in 1980. It was at the Saturday night banquet honoring Robert LeFevre that Rampart Institute was given birth.

Some of the Projects of Rampart Institute:

- •Seminars by Robert LeFevre on the "Fundamentals of Liberty (usually held monthly).
- •Publication of the in-house "New Rampart" printed every two months.
- Publication of "Rampart Individualist" printed quarterly and edited by Kenneth Gregg, Jr.
- •Weekend intensives in the local mountains by Robert LeFevre, George Smith, Kenneth Gregg, Jr. and others (still in planning stage).
- •Efforts to establish a Libertarian Center (3,000 to 4,000 sq. ft.) in Southern California to house LeFevre's extensive library, and set-up a bookstore, research/reading room, lecture hall and office space for other liberty seeking organizations.

A TRADITION SINCE 1969

This year's conference is the ninth in the nation's oldest libertarian/individualist conference series. Below is a brief history of the conference series:

- YEAR 1969: In May of 1969, the purged West Coast leaders of Young Americans for Freedom created a new organization called the California Libertarian Alliance (CLA). Under the leadership of Dana Rohrabacher, Shawn Steel, Doug Kennel (Gene Berkman), R. Kimberling, Dennis Turner, John Schurman and others, the CLA organized a conference on libertarianism and Austrian economics, held at California State University, Long Beach. Prof. Ludwig von Mises was the keynote speaker along with others including Robert LeFevre, Tibor Machan, and Phillip Abbott Luce. Dr. Nathaniel Branden was scheduled to attend but refused to speak after discovering that some of the conference organizers had been associated with the conservative Young Americans for Freedom. Branden attended and addressed the conference several years later. More than 200 students appeared at this one-day conference.
- **YEAR 1970:** The "Left-Right Festival of Liberation" was held at the University of Southern California (USC), and was attended by some 500 eager listeners. This February conference featured F.A. Harper, Tibor Machan, Karl Hess, Carl Oglesby and others.
- YEAR 1970: A November conference repeated the theme of the May conference, "The Annual Festival of Liberation." Held at USC, the conference featured Paul Goodman, Prof. Murray Rothbard, Dr. Thomas Szasz, Skye D'Aureas, Robert Love, Lowell Ponte and others. Some 700 persons attended.
- **YEAR-1971:** The fourth conference, held at USC, entitled simply "Libertarian Conference," featured Michael Engler, Lowell Ponte, Don Franzen, Phillip Abbott Luce, Roy Childs and others. It was held in November.
- **YEAR 1972:** Again held at USC, the fifth conference was billed as a "Symposium on The Political Implications of Modern Psychology" in February. Some of the main speakers included Dr. Nathaniel Branden, Robert LeFevre, George Bach, Carl Faber, David Harris, and Roy Childs.
- YEAR 1973: The sixth conference centered on "The Future of Victimless Crimes" in February at USC. It featured Dr. Thomas Szasz, Dr. Nathaniel Branden, Prof. John Hospers, Robert LeFevre, and the Los Angeles Police Chieft, Tom Redden, who, despite his conservative image, spoke in favor of lessening pot penalties. Richard D. Hongisto, sheriff of San Francisco County, also spoke saying that police often ignore enforcement of violent crimes in order to go after easy drug bust arrests. Some 500 people attended the conference.
- YEAR 1977: The seventh conference, entitled "The Future of Freedom" in April (at USC), is best remembered for the debate between Prof. David Friedman (son of the Nobel laureate, Prof. Milton Friedman), and Tom Hayen (co-founder of the SDS and Jane Fonda's husband). The conference also featured Soviet dissenter Pavel Litvinov; law professor Norm Karlin; science fiction writer Poul Anderson; psychologist Nathaniel Branden; futurologist Jerome Tuccille; philosopher John Hospers; tax-resistance attorney Jack Matonis; and others.
- YEAR 1980: The eighth conference, titled "Future of Freedom Conference II," was held in April at Cypress College in Orange County, Calif. It featured the inventor of the 'Laffer Curve,' Prof. Arthur Laffer; author of *Illuminatus* trilogy, Robert Anton Wilson; former speech writer for President Nixon and Senator Barry Goldwater, Karl Hess; and with Jack Matonis, Robert LeFevre, John Pugsley, John Hospers, George Smith, David Bergland, Anthony Hargis, Sandy Shakocius, Carl Nicolai, Lowell Ponte, Samuel E. Konkin III and others.


