

IN THE BEGINNING

The Future of Freedom Conference series began in 1969 with a keynote speech by Prof. Ludwig von Mises. Called the "Ludwig von Mises Conference," over 200 students attended the first conference at Cal State Univ., Long Beach. The conference was in response to a break with the nation-wide Young Americans for Freedom (YAF) by libertarian YAF members. These libertarian members (Dana Rohrabacher, Shawn Steel, Doug Kennel, R. Kimberling, Dennis Turner, John Schurman and others) were purged from YAF and quickly formed the California Libertarian Alliance. One of their first projects was to organize a conference around libertarian, decentralist, voluntaryist, individualist and objectivist principles.

Leonard Liggio is President of the Institute for Humane Studies. He studied history at Georgetown and Fordham Universities. He taught diplomatic history at the City College of New York, and American foreign policy at the State University of New York and American foreign policy at the State University of New York College at Old Westbury. He has directed numerous conferences for IHS on foreign relations and the constitutional issues of American foreign policy, often in conjunction with the late Dr. Felix Morley, author of Federalism and Freedom. He was co-editor of Watershed of Empire, and author of "National Security Management and American Foreign Policy."

Barry Reid is the founder of Eden Press in Fountain Valley, California. Reid's first book was *The Paper Trip*, a unique approach to achieving personal privacy through a change of identity. In 1976 he was interviewed by 60 minutes on how to create alternative identities. In 1979, the U.S. Justice Department, annoyed at his activities and books, wrote that Barry Reid is a "hero to the underworld." He graduated from UCLA with a B.A. in Political Science and later received his M.A. in Spanish Literature. He recently began publishing a newsletter called "Privacy Hints" which shows citizens how to achieve privacy.

George Smith has spoken frequently at the Future of Freedom Conferences and has proved to be one of our most popular speakers. Author of Atheism: The Case Against God, he studied philosophy at the University of Arizona. He is a research fellow for the Institute for Humane Studies, which is funding his new book on voluntary schooling us. government schooling. Smith has lectured extensively for the CATO Institute.

John Hospers is among the most influential and widely read libertarians. He is currently a USC professor of philosophy. Hospers ran for president of the United States in 1972 on the Libertarian Party ticket, and later ran for governor of California in 1974. His article in The Freeman (June, 1983), has generated more mail (and controversy) than anything he had previously written. He is the author of Will Capitalism Survive?, Understanding the Arts, and more recently, Human Conduct.

Ruth B. Hill is a journalist with a persevering interest in the subject of the American Indian. She took 25 years to complete her book *Hanta* Yo. She has been in contact with more than 1,000 indians from all western tribes, has investigated countless ethnological and anthropological papers on Plains Indians and has traveled each summer for 20 years throughout the U.S. and Canada in order to authenticate every scene and incident in *Hanta Yo*. With language collaborator Chunksa Yuha, a full-blooded Santee Sioux, she studied all the Sioux dialects, rituals and songs.

Barbara Branden is the author of the forthcoming biography *The Passion of Ayn Rand*, to be published shortly. She was a long-time associate of Ayn Rand and is the former Managing Editor of *The Objectivist*. Branden has degrees in philosophy from UCLA and New York University. She has spoken frequently at recent libertarian gatherings, including last year's Future of Freedom Conference.

Formerly an instructor at the University of Chicago Law School (1964-65), he also was a 1972 Libertarian Party candidate for Congress. In addition to his law practice, Klausner is chair of the Libertarian Law Council and a senior editor of *Reason* magazine, and a vice-president of the Reason Foundation. He received the 1982 Lawyer of the Year Award from the Constitutional Rights Foundation and the Los Angeles County Bar Association.



Tibor Machan is a senior Fellow of the Reason Foundation, and editor of the journal, Reason Papers. He edited the recently released book The Libertorian Reader and co-edited with Bruce Johnson Rights and Regulation and Recent Works in Philosophy. He is now working on at least two texts, one on Business Ethics and another book on Marxism and Individualism. He is presently Visiting Distinguished Professor of Philosophy at the University of San Diego.



Jay Snelson, lecturer, writer, and educator, is the Director and Founder of the Free Market Society—dedicated to the principles of free trade and voluntary exchange. In 1979, Mr. Snelson created Human Action Seminars to help further these goals. From 1964 through 1978, he was instrumental in building the market success of the Free Enterprise Institute of Los Angeles (founded by physicist A. J. Galambos). During that time, Snelson was the Senior Lecturer and Professor of Volitional Science. Since graduating from UCLA in 1959, Snelson has devoted most of his time to lecturing and to the enterpreneuring of educational institutions that are designed to give educated, intelligent, and successful adults the ideas they can apply to convert SUPERPROBLEMS into SUPERSOLUTIONS.



Sandy Shaw is one of the leading researchers on the aging process. In 1980, she co-authored with Durk Pearson the best-selling book Life Extension: A Practical Scientific Approach. Its sequel, The Life Extension Companion which she co-authored, has also become a bestseller. Sandy graduated from UCLA in 1966 with a degree in chemistry, specializing in biochemistry. Her consultant work covers a multitude of subjects including her consulting work in films (TV and movies). She has made numerous media appearances along with lecturing on intelligence increase, life extension and nutrition, physiology, immune system function, etc. Sandy currently does contract food and cosmetic technology work as well as futurology consulting for organizations such as Walt Disney Educational Media, General Mills and Future General Co.



Robert LeFevre has been a fountainhead of the west coast libertarian movement almost since its inception. He is also one of the most controversial libertarians on the Issues of justice and pacifism. LeFevre has had an extensive career in both broadcasting and journalism. In 1956 he founded the Freedom School in Colorado Springs, Colorado (later renamed Rampart College and moved to Santa Ana, California). He is the author of numerous books including This Bread is Mine, The Nature of Man and His Government, The Philosophy of Ownership, Lift Her Up Tenderly and the booklets Good Government: Hope or Illusion? and Does Government Protection Protect? His editorials appear regularly in the Freedom Newspaper chain, The Register, He also operates Pine Tree Press.



Bernard Siegan is a Distinguished Professor of Law and Director of Law and Economic Studies at the University of San Diego School of Law. He received his J.D. degree from the University of Chicago law School, and was a practicing attorney from 1950 to 1973. His books include Land Use Without Zoning, Other People's Property, Economic Liberties and the Constitution. He is editor of and contributor to numerous other books. Between 1974 and 1979 he wrote a weekly column for the Freedom newspaper chain. Siegan currently teaches courses on Constitutional Law, Land Use, and Law and Economics.



Tom Hazlett teaches at the University of California at Davis. He is senior editor of the Manhattan Report on Economic Policy. He has written for such publications as Reader's Digest, The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, The Chicago Tribune, The Los Angeles Times, Reason, Inquiry, and Across the Board. His article, "The Supply Side's Weak Side: An Austrian's Critique" appeared in Supply Side Economics: A Critical Appraisal, published in 1982.



Edith Effron worked for the New York Times magazine after graduating from the Columbia School of Journalism. In addition to the Times, she has worked for Time, Life, Look and has free-lanced for most of the major magazines. She wrote a best selling book, The News Twisters, and collaborated with William Simon on his besteller, A Time for Truth. She was also the "Newswatch" columnist in T.V. Guide for many years. Her most recent book is The Apocalyptics, Cancer and the Big Lie.

Jack Wheeler is a freelance adventurer and writer with a Ph.D in philosophy from the University of Southern California. He is the author of *The Adventurer's Guide* and has recently done a series of articles for *Reason* magazine dealing with anti-Soviet guerilla movements in the Third World. Considered the Indiana Jones of the libertarian movement, Wheeler has just returned from an excursion deep inside Afghanistan and Angola. He is noted for his excellent slide shows depicting the battle-scarred life of anti-Soviet guerillas.


